About QAI Program

Christian Counseling Program:

The Christian Counseling program is structured on three progressive levels:

Certificate Level: 60 ECTS credits Diploma Level: 120 ECTS credits Bachelor's Degree Level: 180 ECTS credits

This program is designed to support believers from diverse backgrounds, Christians originating from the Middle East, and missionaries from the West. Each program provides the necessary tools and educational opportunities for effective service in Europe and beyond.

Instructors include Christian leaders and experienced missionaries who have dedicated decades to service in Africa and the Middle East. These educators have meticulously developed courses to equip Christian leaders in Europe and the West with the knowledge, wisdom, skills, and mindset required to engage with individuals from diverse backgrounds in a fresh, well-informed, empathetic, and meaningful manner. The aim is to represent the Kingdom of God strategically in a more contextual, constructive, and fruitful way.

This program enhances intercultural competencies among church and ministry leaders, empowering them to facilitate their congregations' growth in intercultural awareness and effective evangelism.

Participants will gain biblical knowledge, practical skills, personal readiness, and missiological perspectives for cross-cultural ministry and global missions.

The program is structured to:

- Offer insights into diverse worldviews.
- Address the necessity and opportunity for cross-cultural engagement.
- Cultivate a deep understanding of different faiths and practices.
- Equip Christian leaders to articulate their faith effectively.
- Highlight testimonies of believers engaging with diverse backgrounds.
- Provide avenues for practical application of acquired knowledge.

European Credit Transfer System

• QAI adheres to the European Union's Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS), established to implement standardized procedures ensuring the academic acknowledgment of studies completed abroad. This system facilitates the assessment and comparison of studies, as well as the seamless transfer of credits between different educational institutions.

ECTS Credits Convert to Study Hours

ECTS credits are values assigned to course units to represent the student workload required to complete them. They reflect the amount of work each course demands relative to the workload of a full academic year at the institution, encompassing lectures, practical work, seminars, private study (in the library or at home), and examinations or other assessment activities.

In the ECTS framework, 60 credits correspond to the workload of one academic year. One ECTS credit is equivalent to 25 to 30 working hours. The distribution of working hours per credit is approximately as follows:

Learning hours	40%	12 hours
Tutorials	4%	1 hour
Work in Groups/Practical Work/Forums	17%	4.5 hours
Self-study (at home/library)	32%	8 hours

- New students cannot enroll in the second year due to prerequisites.

Program Elements

Christian Counseling Certificate Components (Total: 60 ECTS credits)

The certificate consists of 9 core courses. Five of these are core essentials focusing primarily on Biblical studies, and four are concentrated courses focusing on Christian counseling and its application. In addition to the 9 core courses, students are required to complete an introductory course, 18 ECTS credits of elective courses, and 13 ECTS credits for non-formal components such as practical ministry, training, conferences, community service, and language.

Diploma in Christian Counseling (Total: 120 ECTS credits)



The diploma level builds upon the foundational certificate by introducing more advanced coursework and practical applications. It consists of 11 core courses (33 ECTS), focusing on deeper theological concepts, psychology, crisis counseling, and research methods. Students are also required to complete 15 ECTS credits of elective courses, covering topics such as family counseling, psychological disorders, and leadership integration. Additionally, a 12-credit research project, case study, or thesis is required, enabling students to demonstrate independent research skills and apply their learning in real-world counseling scenarios.

Bachelor's Degree in Christian Counseling (Total: 180 ECTS credits)

The bachelor's degree level represents the highest academic achievement in the program. It includes 12 advanced core courses (36 ECTS), covering crisis counseling, therapeutic techniques, addiction counseling, and psychopathology. Students are required to complete 9 ECTS credits of electives, exploring cultural influences on counseling, lifespan counseling, and mental health law. A significant portion of this program (15 ECTS) is dedicated to practical ministry and internship experiences, allowing students to gain hands-on experience under the supervision of ministry partners. The program culminates in advanced counseling practicums and research projects, equipping students to become highly skilled, knowledgeable, and ethically grounded Christian counselors.

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QAI adheres to the European Union's Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS), ensuring the academic recognition of studies. This system standardizes assessment, facilitates study comparisons, and enables credit transfers between institutions.



ECTS Credits to Study Hours Conversion:
